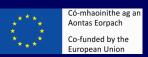

WHAT IS AN LOCAL TRAINING INITIATIVE?

The Regional Skills & Training Centre (RSTC), in collaboration with local community organisations, provide flexible Local Training Initiatives (LTIs) for unemployed persons. The LTI programme is designed to provide opportunities for marginalized learners who are unable to participate in other ETB training interventions for personal, social or geographic reasons.

The Local Training Initiative programme supports many organisations engaged in a wide variety of activities including genealogy, environment, heritage, tourism, arts, sports and leisure. Some projects are targeted at specific groups experiencing disadvantage such as homeless people, recovering addicts, prisoners and travelers.



The MOT LTI 20-week training programme provides basic social and technical skills for the participants of Tabor House in Navan and members of the Trim and surrounding community.

COURSE CONTENT

Personal and Interpersonal Development. Drawing, Painting and ICDL,

While there is a good emphasis based on the practical skills to be learned, this course is delivered under the ethos of self-development and personal advancement.

All Modules are certified at QQI Level 4 or equivalent.

Mission Statement

MOT provides person centred training that empowers adults in recovery from addiction. This is achieved through a non-judgemental, supportive approach which respects the Dignity, Privacy and Circumstance of each learner.

Vision Statement

MOT will provide a clear and progressive future direction for individuals recovering from addiction. In addition to accredited training our person centred programme restores self-worth, respect and belonging leading to a bright new future.

Objective

To assist unemployed men aged 18 to 35 years of age that are in recovery from addiction by providing accredited training programmes, advice and guidance that will support them in realizing their own potential. To enhance the sustainability of their recovery through peer support, individual learning plans, care-planning and progression path planning.

Classes are run Monday - Friday from 9:30am to 2.30pm. *

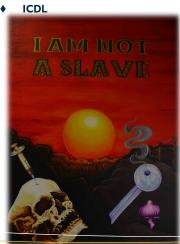

Meath Opportunities for Training (MOT) is a Local Training Initiative that was set up in to assist people who are in recovery from an addiction.

It is funded through the Louth and Meath Education and Training Board (LMETB).

ENTRY TO THE COURSE

Priority will be given to male participants who are in recovery and attending Tabor House residential centre in Navan or who are connected to local addiction services.

Priority is given to persons that have been on the live register for longer periods of time, especially those on it over a year.

Interested persons should contact their local Intreo Office for details on how to be referred to the programme or contact MOT direct.

No formal education is required.

NATIONAL FRAMEWORK OF OUALIFICATIONS

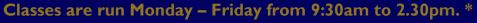
Qualifications frameworks describe the qualifications of an education and training system and how they interlink. National Qualifications Frameworks describe what learners should know, understand and be able to do on the basis of a given qualification. These frameworks also show how learners can move from one qualification, or qualification level, to another within a system.

QUALITY AND QUALIFICATIONS IRELAND





Quality and Qualifications Ireland (QQI) is a state agency established by the Quality Assurance and Qualifications (Education and Training) Act 2012. QQI is an amalgamation of the previously operational Further Education and Training Awards Council (FETAC); the Higher Education and Training Awards Council (HETAC); the Irish Universities Quality Board (IUQB) and the National Qualifications Authority of Ireland (NQAI).

Learners use a moderate range of drawing media and view finders expressively, analytically and for graphic purposes and to use a range of drawing styles and techniques including linear, tonal and perspective studies in two & three dimensions.

Assessments

Assessments take place periodically throughout the programme dependent on the criteria set down by the LMETB /RSTC in their Assessment Instrument Specifications.

Assessment can take a number of forms:

Portfolio A portfolio is a collection of documents, drawings and writing that demonstrates that a learner has the appropriate prior and experiential learning to earn certification.

Exercise An exercise is a specific task which must be carried out under given conditions. These are used to test specific skills or skills which are not easily accessed by a subjects traditional outcomes.

Skills Demonstration This is a practical task which can be used to assess the level of skills of an individual learner.

Examination The main difference between this and other assessment instruments is that the outcome is directly related to a specific set of questions where there can only be a correct or incorrect answer. Good examinations are structured to allow a learner to achieve grades for partially correct answers.
